WHAT IS THE CONTEST ABOUT?

We want to promote reading and thinking about stories. Stories give children a glimpse into different cultures, times and experiences. Stories teach children lessons about life and the world they live in.

The objective of the Visual Decoder for Stories Contest is to encourage children to use pictures to aid retelling, exploring and consolidating what they know about a story.

Children tap on the brain's visual processing ability and draw simple pictures to represent a story's key elements. In the process, they reflect and engage more deeply with the text to discover insights about the story. This activity strengthens comprehension and develops creativity.




















WHO & WHAT

Draw a simple map showing 1 or 2 important locations in this story.




WHEN $[A \rightarrow B \rightarrow C]$
